Tuckahoe Garden Club 2020-2021 Guidelines for Health & Safety There is nothing more important than the health and safety of our members during this time of Covid-19. To that end, Tuckahoe Garden Club will observe the following guidelines for this program year:

- Our Tuckahoe Garden Club will follow the guidelines set forth by the State of Virginia in regard to covid-19 protocols (numbers of congregants at meetings, face coverings, etc).
- If you or someone you are in close contact with has had known exposure to persons with covid-19, please refrain from attending any club-related activity for a minimum of two weeks.
- Face coverings shall be required at all gatherings, both inside and outside, and ask that all members maintain social distancing
- Attendance monitoring will be waived but all members are encouraged to attend as many meetings as they are able and feel inclined.
- Both the September and October meetings will be held in outside venues.
- Hospitality will be creatively organizing drinks and snacks for meeting so as to be single-serving and easily picked up by individual members.
- There will be extra masks and hand sanitizers at all meetings for any members who may be in need.
- We will continue to employ decision-making in a fluid manner, adapting to changes in the ever-evolving health situation around us. This may include meeting cancellations/postponements, possible venue changes, and ZOOM meetings as an option.
- The TGC website will be the primary source for any changes that may be required this year. Members will be directed there, via email, as changes are required.

Virtual Presentation: The Green

Working in conjunction with Glave & Holmes Architecture, Dave Gerstenmaier is Senior Principal/President of HG Design Studio, and Principal Landscape Architect for The Green at the Science Museum of Virginia. This project will reclaim two acres of surface parking lot and reestablish the front acreage of the Science Museum of Virginia's historic Broad Street Station flagship as a new six-acre public park. Featuring native trees and plants that buffer busy Broad Street and offer shaded walking paths and intimate gathering places, the project offers a high visibility opportunity to restore developed land into public green space. The Green represents a bold step in transforming the Museum's 36-acre campus into a living classroom and demonstration site for best practices in addressing the effects of climate change in urban settings. Informed by data collected through the museum's citizen science initiatives that document urban heat island effect, air quality, and stormwater Best Management Practices on site, this project fulfills the Museum's mission-inspiring Virginians to enrich their lives through science--through an evidencebased approach to environmental resource management. As the only public park along the 7.5 mile Pulse Corridor, The Green will serve as a model of the importance of green infrastructure in creating a resilient, walkable, and livable city.

Holiday Floral Design Tip From Peyton Wells




A Boxwood Kissing Ball is an alternate to the traditional sprig of mistletoe. Try using a thinskinned potato, such as a Yukon Gold, as the base, instead of the suggested Styrofoam ball. The moisture in the potato will help keep the cut greens fresh. Be sure to soak your greens in water for a day before arranging.
